SET-UP (BEGIN BY 8:15 AM):

□ Set-up Tables:

Use (1) 12 foot folding rectangular table found in the "chair closet" for the food and juice.

Use the table below the opening to the kitchen for self-serve coffee/tea pots and supplies.

In warm weather, you can set-up two of the 12 foot rectangular folding tables on the patio for coffee hour.

Cover tables with the light blue polka dot oilcloth tablecloths located in the pantry.

Note: You may find that someone from the 7:30 service has already setup the tables and prepared the coffee for you on Saturday.

☐ Make Coffee:

Use 40 Cup Coffee Pots located in the pantry. Instructions (how many cups of grounds to use) are posted on the bulletin board in the kitchen.

Start coffee when you go to church at 9:00 am. Plug into the outlet in the kitchen below the bulletin board:

Regular: (1) Pot of 40 Cups Decaf: (1) Pot of 30 Cups

□ Tea:

Heat water in the electric teakettle or in tea kettle on the stove. Use white carafe or tea pot to keep water hot. Set out basket with tea bags (found in the pantry.)

	Set Out Supplies:
	Sugar, powdered creamer, napkins, paper plates & cups, and stir sticks (found in the pantry). Milk or half/half for coffee.
	Use mugs or paper cups to reduce clean-up. Paper supplies are located in the pantry.
	Pitchers and carafes can be found in the pantry.
Keep	it simpleDon't hesitate to use paper cups and serve from the container your snacks came in!
<u>FINA</u>	L SET-UP:
-	plan to attend the 9am service, be one of the first ones to take communion so you can finish set-up.
	Put the (40) Cup Regular and (30) Cup Decaf along with coffee/tea supplies on the table by the kitchen for <u>self-serve</u> .
	Place the food and drinks on the tables.
	Be sure you wear your nametag.

CLEA	<u>AN-UP:</u>
	If you plan on attending the 11am service the clean up can be done after the service.
	The choir and a few folks will come to coffee hour before the 11 am service. You can get started cleaning up, but please wait to do your final clean-up after they've had a chance to have some coffee and snacks (about 10:50.)
	Wipe the oilcloth tablecloths with a sponge, fold and place back in the pantry.
	Wash and put away dishes. Instructions for running the dishwasher are on the side of the machine.
	Take home leftovers. Please do not put in refrigerator or freezer.
	Wash and put away coffee pots. Coffee grounds should be put in trashcans and NOT down the garbage disposal.
	Clean the sinks and counter tops.
	Put the tables back into the chair closet.
	We greatly appreciate it if you could take the dirty dish towels and sponges home to wash and return. If that doesn't work for you, place dirty dish towels and sponges into the laundry bag located next to the refrigerator (extra bags are stored in the laundry basket in the pantry).
