## Looking Ahead to Pentecost and Summer

- **April 29<sup>th</sup>** - Last Sunday Schedule Town Hall conversation at 10:15am in Overby and Youth Sunday
- **May 13<sup>th</sup>** – We will celebrate Ascension Day even though the actual day falls on a Thursday.
- **May 20<sup>th</sup>** – one service at 10am for Pentecost Sunday – weather permitting, may we will have church on the patio?
- **May 27<sup>th</sup>** beginning of a two service Sunday Schedule.

## Education

We will be wrapping up Acts of the Apostles in the next few weeks, AND we will finish the school year with a series on Death, Mourning and Afterlife from an Inter-religious perspective. Along with the theological, there will be some “nuts and bolts” end of life planning. We have not finalized the schedule. Generally:

- **May 6<sup>th</sup>** Amanda Kiernan Martin – Wills, Trust and Giving – She will preach also
- **May 13<sup>th</sup>** Mother’s Day -- no education
- **May 20<sup>th</sup>** Pentecost – One service, no education
- **May 27<sup>th</sup> to mid-June** – we will host a Rabbi and an Imam who will use the education hour to talk about their perspectives on death and dying.

## The developing Sunday Schedule as a result of two town halls, surveys, and conversations.

- Schedule timing proposed—8:30am & 10am
- We **will** be going to two Sunday morning services on May 27<sup>th</sup>, it will be a long lasting change (not just a summer schedule).

**Why this Schedule?** To support fellowship. The surveys and town halls revealed fellowship as critical to those who filled out the survey and those who participated in the town halls. There was a strong desire to have connections between services and the schedule below allows for this cross pollination of the two worshipping groups.

## Sunday Morning – two services 8:30am & 10am

<b>8:30 -9:15am</b>	Service
<b>9:15-9:30am</b>	Coffee/transition
<b>9:30- 9:55am</b>	Some kind of fellowship and probably food maybe rotating with education. Working with leaders on the nut and bolts of this.
<b>10-11am</b>	Service
<b>11-11:05am</b>	Transition
<b>11:10- 11:40am</b>	Possibly Adult and children’s formation as 6-8 week series, maybe not every Sunday?
<b>Service-Liturgy</b> (still evolving)	8:30am still quiet and contemplative 10am will be a blend of the current 9am & 11am

## Elements of Both services in the Blend.

We trust Darita’s leadership and the choir’s gifts. Our two choirs together will rock. Some hymns likely combined with contemporary music. Young people’s time will remain. The liturgical prayers and Eucharistic prayers change with the seasons (like we do now).

**Choir Town Halls** Meeting with the two choirs on April 17th and 19th to collaborate on the best way to blend the services from a musical perspective. We want the choir to enjoy singing, and I will do everything I can to support their ministry.

He lives in Danville and so, with us, has an intense personal interest in this topic.

### SARGENT'S WOMEN – WHO ARE THEY? WHAT ARE THEIR STORIES?




John Singer Sargent (1856 – 1925) was the leading portrait painter of his generation creating almost 900 portraits and 2000 water colors during his lifetime. Besides being beautiful to look at, many of his portraits of women have a quality that invites the viewer to wonder who this woman was and what happened to her during her life before and after sitting for this renowned (and expensive) artist. In this book, author Donna Lucey explores the stories behind 4 of the portraits of women.

Sally Fairchild was the golden girl of the Fairchild family and is one in Sargent's portrait. But it is her sister, Lucia who has the interesting life becoming a well-known painter of miniatures, the primary support of her children and her artist husband – in spite of poverty and multiple-sclerosis.

Isabella Stewart Gardner scandalized Boston society during her life and left an enduring legacy with the art she collected and the museum that bears her name there. She was a baseball fan scandalizing the city by wearing a headband with "White Socks" emblazoned on it to a Boston Symphony Concert.

## TREASURER’S REPORT- MARCH 19, 2018

### Financial Highlights

- 2018 budget based on 164 pledges totaling \$650,300
- To date we have received an additional 5 pledges for \$16,360
- Total of \$91,467 prepaid pledges
- 2018 Budget vs Actuals through February

Expenses – Personnel expense - \$5,173 under (clergy compensation under, lay compensation under and contractors under), Programs - \$(4,668) over (Altar Guild over, Administrative over, Utilities under, Contingency under).

## MARCH VESTRY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

### St Timothy's Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting Highlights – March 2018

The vestry met in Grace House on Monday, March 19, at 6:30 pm.

#### MOTIONS:

- Updated Letters of Agreement for Pastor Todd Bryant and Rev. Susan Geissler-O'Neil were approved
- Pastor Todd is discussing the possibility of hosting a Tai Chi class on the parish grounds.
- The bookkeeper, Liz Haughey, was approved as the primary contact for St. Timothy's with the Quick Books program.
- Allison Fletcher and Neal Matsunaga were approved as the official contact people for the Episcopal Church Foundation EMS account
- The usual meeting minutes for the previous meeting, treasure's report, rector's report and submitted commission reports were approved.

#### ACTION ITEMS:

- Pastor Todd is working on a plan to implement the Diocese of California Safe Church policies
- Vestry members will send their certificates from the Shield the Vulnerable training to Pastor Todd.  
(Shield the Vulnerable is no longer in business.)

Pastor Todd discussed the results of the parish Sunday Service Survey and plans for at least one additional town hall to discuss the possible Sunday Service time changes. Due to the feedback that not everyone received the email regarding the survey, it was decided to send the Survey email a second time and to have paper copies of the survey available on March 25<sup>th</sup> at the second town hall meeting on the topic for people to fill out.

The Finance and the Property Committees are reviewing the Reserve Study by the John D. Beatty & Company commissioned by the 2017 vestry with the aim of submitting a 5-year maintenance plan to the vestry in April.

Pastor Todd discussed the Safe Church policy from the Diocese of California and outlined possible actions to implement the policy. Roz Adekunle has consented to be the coordinator. Pastor Todd is working on plans for more specific future activities and a time-table.

Parish members are welcome to attend Vestry meetings. The next meeting is on **Wednesday, April 18, 2018** at 6:30 pm. The minutes of the vestry meeting will be filed in the Parish Office after they are approved by the Vestry.


