

Dear Parish family,

St. Tim's relies on Pledges to support and fund all our financial obligations from property maintenance to our ministries and outreach. St. Tim's is our very special Parish home. It is worth our financial support to keep it that way.

With declining pledges, St. Tim's has seen its income drop from the \$900,000s level to the mid \$600,000s of today. Even with the decline in pledges, with good stewardship and the generosity of our parish families, we have maintained reasonable financial health even with Covid restrictions. However, 2022 presents another challenge as our costs are now rising much faster than in the recent past. This should not be a surprise to any of us.

With a 2022 Budget deficit of \$127,000, our Treasurer and Senior Warden believe it is now time for all of St Tim's family to rise to the occasion and address this deficit. I support this too.

Together we can fix it. I request you consider pledging. Simply send an email to our Pledge Secretary, pledges@sainttimothysdanville.org, stating your name and pledge or pick up a pledge card in the Office or Narthex. Just be sure to place it in a sealed envelope made out to the Pledge Secretary before dropping off in the Office. I ask you to do this **by Easter Sunday, April 17**<sup>th</sup>.

Any pledge or one-time donation, no matter its size, will be appreciated.

We can get St. Tim's back on better financial footing. We can do this. Together, we can fix this! May God guide us on this effort.

# HABITAT FOR HUMANITY EAST BAY BUILD DAY

Thanks to our annual grants from the Outreach Committee through Fruits of the Harvest donations, Habitat for Humanity is offering the opportunity for 15 volunteers from our parish to participate in a Build Day at the H4H Esperanza site in Walnut Creek on Friday April 22 830am-4pm.

**Registration:** Please ask the group to sign up for the day at: http://vhub.at/StTimothysDanville. Through

this dedicated page, volunteers can sign up directly for the volunteer day reserved for your group. Each volunteer can simply click 'Sign Up' for their event, create a brief user profile or sign into an existing account, and reserve their spot. We ask volunteers to sign up at least 2 weeks prior to their build day. Once volunteers have registered online, they will receive and email with all the specifics about the day. Volunteers can also view all the details for the event

at the website above by clicking on the event title.

### **Safety Reminders:**

Effective January 1, 2022, all volunteers participating in any in-person activities are required to provide either proof of full vaccination against Covid-19 or a negative PCR or Antigen test administered within 72 hours of in-person activities. As of March 8, 2022, volunteers who show proof of vaccination against COVID-19 are no longer required to wear a mask. We still highly encourage all volunteers to bring and wear a mask and require volunteers who have not shown proof of vaccination to wear a mask while volunteering with HEBSV. Read the full policy

# Help Californians be part of June 18th PPC Actions in DC

Dear friends -

We write to update you about the Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival (PPC) actions and to ask your help to get people from California to PPC's *Mass Poor People's & Low-Wage Workers' Assembly and Moral March on Washington and to the Polls in 2022* coming up this June18<sup>th</sup>, see https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KR xYlpdeNM

The Poor People's Campaign is a national campaign launched in 2018 to address the interlocking injustices of systemic racism, poverty, ecological devastation & denial of health care, militarism & the war economy, and the false moral narrative of religious nationalism. *Before* the pandemic there were 140 million people in the US who were poor or one emergency away from economic ruin. Since March 2020, while hundreds of thousands of people have died, millions are on the edge of hunger and eviction, still without health care, living wages. Any nation that ignores nearly half of its citizens *is in a moral, economic and political crisis*.



June 18 will be a generationally transformative and disruptive gathering of poor and low-wealth people, state leaders, faith communities, moral allies, unions and partnering organizations pressing for this crisis to be addressed. This is a unique opportunity to let legislators and policy makers hear the stories and struggles from people their actions impact. CA PPC is currently mobilizing the MORE tour across the state to reach people for a series of key events to build for the DC actions including a western regional mobilization in LA on May16 sign-up form.

Will you help Californians impacted by poverty, racism and other injustices get to Washington, DC, in June? It's estimated that airfare and lodging for people traveling from the west coast will total about \$3000/person. Can you help sponsor someone from CA who would not otherwise be able to take part in the PPC's Mass Poor People's & Low-Wage Workers' Assembly and Moral March on Washington and to the Polls in 2022? 
# ST TIMOTHY'S BOOK GROUP



Adventure Week is truly a unique camp experience that focuses on developing leadership skills, spirituality, worship, and community. Campers participate in service projects as well as overnight camping trips. Outreach activities have included working at local soup kitchens, providing meals to the homeless and hungry in the area, and helping local churches with various projects. Backing trips have included overnighting on the Sonoma Coast, Point Reyes, and Angel Island.

Ever wonder what it is like to be a camp counselor at St. Dorothy's? Our Counselor-In-Training (CIT) program provides participants with the opportunity to learn about the day-to-day running of camp, leadership styles, working with youth and peers. Attending the CIT program is strongly encouraged if you are interested in serving as a summer camp counselor in future summers, but it is not required.

# TELL ME THE TRUTH ABOUT RACISM

Every Sunday March 6 – April 10 following the 8:00 and 10:00 service Peg M. will offer an inter-generational program to wonder about racism. We will meet in the Parish Hall and see a short story of God's love for the world unfold and be invited to wonder about it.



Have you ever wanted to understand racism from the beginning? The very beginning? <u>Tell Me the Truth About Racism</u> is a story told in 6 parts that frames the history of racism through the lens of our faith beginning with the creation of the world in week one and ending in week 6 with the world as it is today, where the lie that caused racism tries to hide in plain sight. Each week, we will be reminded that racism was never a part of God's dream for the world.

This offers a powerful grounding for an important discussion to have in a multi-generational setting. Come whether you are young or old, whether you have a big family or live alone, whether you think you know all there is to know about racism, or you want to enter the conversation at the very beginning. Each Sunday for six weeks, we will gather after church in the Parish Hall and hear the story together. Then, you may be part of a small group and wonder after the model of Godly Play. Come pray and wonder with us.
