OPTIONS RECOVERY SERVICES & COMMUNITY EVENTS UPDATE

During the COVID pandemic, Options has remained committed to the people and communities we serve by providing high-quality substance use disorder outpatient, intensive outpatient, testing, and housing services. Dr. Davida Coady founded Options on the premise that people and their families who suffer from substance use disorders who need our help are never turned away or forgotten, that our doors are always open, and that people must get the help that they need, when they need it most. The pandemic does not separate us from these values. In response to the virus, Options continues to operate with the following safety precautions until it is safe to open to in-person treatment:

- implements telehealth services, providing video and audio conferencing at both individual and group levels by skilled counselors and clinicians
- remains open for new referrals and intake of new clients, including clients released from prisons and from other organizations forced to curtain or limit their own services
- implements preventative and precautionary measures, including health screening at intake and at all residences and clinical settings
- continues to provide treatment, drug testing, and recovery residence services throughout northern Alameda County.

Options residents are fully vaccinated and continue to observe COVID protocols, receiving telehealth services and direct support at the houses. New Options clients who screened as potentially virus infected were quarantined and referred for medical treatment when necessary. Through strict protocols and preventative efforts, the virus has been kept largely at bay.

Due to the success of Options in-prison services, Options has been contracted by the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to expand its Offender Mentor Certification Program to seven prisons through the state of California. Furthermore, the California Board of State and Community Corrections has awarded Options funds to serve reentry clients as they return to society from prison. Options takes this opportunity to thank our many supporters, and to invite you to join with us in supporting and celebrating our clients' recovery through these activities:

Options' Call for Arts: Supported by the California Arts Council, Options provides a Reentry Through the Arts program which allows Options clients to participate in video and graphic arts training and production activities. All of the production projects are directly tied to the central theme of addiction recovery. Production projects incorporate graphic art, videos, photographs, recordings, and media production. By telling their own stories, the artists gain perspective and find new ways to express their unique paths to recovery. Over the next year, Options will promote clients' works of art in newsletters, an annual Options calendar, and live and silent auctions at Options events.



Options' Home Improvement Furniture Drive: Options currently houses over 100 clients living in nine Options-owned clean, sober, tobacco-free recovery residences. Due to confinement protocols and reduced rental income, the condition of the houses reached the high standard of being safe and clean. Options is in the process of remodeling the homes and is looking for donations. The houses need updating - new beds, tables, chairs, and couches - and many spaces need to be deep-cleaned and painted. Options' goal is to refresh

and refurbish all nine houses by September 2022. This project is a God's Hands project through Outreach at St. Timothy's, so any contribution anyone would like to make can be made at any time over the next year. The project ends in time for the Gala celebrating Options 25 years of service in September of 2022.

During National Recovery Month, which is September of every year, traditionally the Executive Director of Options gives the sermons at both services in a Sunday in September. Tom Gorhan, retired Executive Director gave the sermons the last two years, and last year Dianna Beamon, the Director of Human Resources and the Criminal Justice clients' programming at Options also gave the sermons in September. This year, on September 5th, Justin Phillips, the new Executive Director of Options, gave both sermons on September 5th.

Other September events this year honoring National Recovery month, included:

September 10th Client Graduation Celebration: During the pandemic, Options implemented a Zoombased graduation ceremony, broadcasted live on Facebook and on Options' website (www.optionsrecovery.org). St. Timothy's Church is the official sponsor of the September event and is recognized in the proceedings. Options graduates tell their moving stories of transformation as they have pursued their sobriety and remained free of drugs and alcohol for a full year! To access Options Graduations, which are held in September, December, March and June every year, at 4:30 pm, just join via Options Recovery Services web site or Options Recovery Services Facebook account.



The December graduation is on the 3rd. In 2022 the graduations for March and June are March 4th and June 3rd respectively.

GARY HUNT GIVING PROJECT EVERY SUNDAY!!





TREASURER'S REPORT

September 15, 2021

Financial Highlights

- Financial results through August are positive overall despite underruns in loose plate offerings and facilities cost sharing due to the underruns being offset by higher than budgeted pledge and contributing income to date. Decrease in net income compared to July month (\$52,436) due mainly to amortization of pledges paid in full in 2021 not including all such pledges in amortization calculation.
- Year to date budget vs actual results, adjusted for amortizing "pledges paid in full" in the current year, are:

Pledge Income difference due mainly to:

Pledges better than budgeted in previous months.

Other Income difference due mainly to:

Loose Plate \$(4,906) and Facilities Cost Sharing \$(10,266) under budget offset by Contributing Income \$11,382 and Special Gifts \$1,150 above budget.

Expenses – Operating expense difference is the sum of a number of under budget items, with the main ones being:

Personnel expenses \$13,326 under budget due mainly to \$6,072 for administrative assistant/office manager and \$1,819 for childcare assistant for being vacant part of the year.

Altar Guild expenses \$1,156 under budget

Music expenses \$1,476 under budget

Christian Formation expenses \$1,012 under budget

Children & Youth Ministry expenses \$1,325 under budget

Fellowship expenses \$1,704 under budget

Administrative expenses \$6,534 under budget

Facilities expenses \$13,835 under budget

Finance expenses \$4,037 under budget

Contingency expenses \$2,027 under budget

ST TIMOTHY'S VESTRY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

SEPTEMBER 2021

The vestry met via Zoom on Wednesday, September 15, at 6:30 pm

MOTIONS:

- The vestry voted to approve spending the funds required to replace the downstairs HVAC system in the Ackerman property and the needed transfer of \$1600 from other funds to cover the cost that cannot be covered by money in the Ackerman maintenance account. The unit will probably not be replaced until it fails per recommendations by the service person.
- The vestry voted to approve the agenda, the minutes of the August meeting and the several reports submitted prior to the meeting by the treasurer, rector, and several of the vestry commissions.

TOPICS DISCUSSED:

- 2022 Budget planning
- Music director search has restarted after the initial search was unsuccessful in hiring a new director.
- Youth ministry Robbie Frederiksen has started meeting with the high school and junior high youth from St. Timothy's and the Alamo United Methodist Church. All the meetings are on Sunday alternating between the two locations.
- Recruitment and training for the Live Stream technical crew is going well.
- Possible Contra Costa County (CCC) requirement to require proof of vaccination. The current CCC requirements **DO NOT** apply to church gatherings.
- Ade A is working with a committee from the Diocese of California in recruiting members for leadership committees.

Parish members are welcome to attend Vestry meetings. The next meeting is on Wednesday, October 99, 2021.

The minutes of the vestry meeting will be filed in the Parish Office after they are approved by the Vestry.
