Wine

Wine will be back in church starting Nov 27th. Taking communion will feel very "BC" (before COVID). You can drink from the cup, you can touch the base of the chalice as you walk by, you can walk right past the chalice as if it does not exist. You can**not** dip. Per diocesan guidelines, parishioner may not dip bread into the chalice.

Wreath Lighting (Nov 27th - Dec 18th)

Each week after the opening song, one family will light the advent wreath according to a very brief liturgy printed in your bulletin.

ADVENT IS COMING

The first Sunday after Thanksgiving, November 27 is the beginning of Advent. We light Advent Candles in church and at home to remind us the Light of Christ is coming into the world. This advent we have a special candle for Advent for families. We can take time to slow down, and pray a short prayer with a Countdown Candle.

The Candle is lit every day—for breakfast or for dinner or even snack time after school! Families can say a short prayer and every day the candle burns closer to the Christmas Day marking on the candle!



On Sunday November 20 after the 10:00 am service, the St. Timothy's Book Group will meet in the Overby Library to discuss: *Her Honor: My Life on the Bench...What Works, What's Broken, and How to Change It* by LaDoris Hazzard Cordell.

In Her Honor, Judge LaDoris Hazzard Cordell provides a rare and thoughtprovoking insider account of our legal system, sharing vivid stories of the cases that came through her courtroom and revealing the strengths, flaws, and muchneeded changes within our courts.



Judge Cordell, the first African American woman to sit on the Superior Court of Northern California, knows firsthand how prejudice has permeated our legal system. And yet, she believes in the system. From ending school segregation to legalizing same-sex marriage, its progress relies on legal professionals and jurors who strive to make the imperfect system as fair as possible.

Her Honor is an entertaining and provocative look into the hearts and minds of judges. Cordell takes you into her chambers where she haggles with prosecutors and defense attorneys and into the courtroom during jury selection and sentencing hearings. She uses real cases to highlight how judges make difficult decisions, all the while facing outside pressures from the media, law enforcement, lobbyists, and the friends and families of the people involved.

LITURGICAL ART FOR THE SEASONS

ADVENT 2022

Advent is a time of preparation. It is a time of reflection and waiting. The Advent wreath is an important part of this season. The four sets of triple banners along the pillars on the side walls represent the four candles on the Advent wreath which are lit every Sunday of Advent leading up to Christmas Eve. The colors are those of the season...purples, blues, and pinks.

The thought behind this piece is that the entire church becomes the Advent wreath and the congregation is the



living greenery. I believe it is very strong and dynamic when seen this way. This piece was created in 2008, and has had added elements every time it appears. It is one of Kathy Will's and my favorites.

Many people were involved in first creating this piece by cutting out all the fabrics which were fused with heat and glued onto a background fabric. Embellishments were added to create different textures. Silks and satin fabrics were used for their shine and suede and dull fabrics were for contrast. On either side of the cross there are accents of hand-made, lacey paper sprayed gold, and even gold foil paper has been added to create interest, movement, and for symbolism.

There are many symbolic elements everywhere. Many sets of three accents represent the Holy Trinity. Look for the small mosaic tiles on the side pieces. The 12 squares of gold on the banners by the cross are reminders of the Apostles. There are strong vertical strokes which symbolize power descending from above or in the opposite direction. "Flames" of gold on the perceived candle shapes were made more prominent over the years. The wavy blocks of color on the background remind me of an abstract landscape with land and water. We welcome you to have your own interpretations and feelings as you look at the artwork and hope it enhances your worship.



A NEW BREEZE IS COMING IN DECEMBER

Breeze is a new church database system that we have adopted to replace the old ParishSoft database. All information has been transferred from the ParishSoft database and has been incorporated into the new Breeze system.

Here are some of the advantages of the new Breeze system:

- Easier access to an online membership directory
 - Each member has control of their profile information (e.g. address, phone number(s), pictures, family information) and what is shown to other members.
- **Phone applications** for both iPhones and Android (Breeze chms). These applications are native to the phones and allow you the same access and ability as from the Web.
- Access to your own **personal giving information**
 - Allows you to see your current giving information and historical information for years in the past.
 - Online giving is easily set up so you do not have to hassle with checks and can be done on a weekly, bi-weekly, monthly, annual, or on-demand basis.


There are many other advantages that Saint Timothy's will realize by utilizing this new system.

- Group communications and management will be easier
- Events and calendaring will make group gatherings easier to manage
- Lots of on-line information on how to use Breeze

In early December, a form will be sent out via email from the Parish Administrator individually to active members of the congregation. It will include information on how to create your account. Once we get your interest in getting an account, we will send you an invitation from Breeze. If you have any problems creating your online account, we will have people helping in Grace House after the church service and available to help over the phone.

There is <u>no requirement</u> to have an online account. If you are happy with how things are done now, nothing will change regarding how you do your membership lookup or your giving.

Net Operating Income	\$53,755	(\$105,735)

- October financials show the following:
 - o Pledge income was close to plan, 53.4 k versus plan of 55.3 k.
 - o Maintenance expense was above plan for the campus. As a result, October net operating income was (25.2 K) versus plan of (\$10.6 k).
- For the YTD through October, the Parish continues to be in decent financial shape. This is because income is higher than plan, partly as a result of the parish's response to our fundraising request this past spring.
