ASSOCIATE RECTOR'S ARTICLE

GRATITUDE. The power of an attentive heart toward all the gifts around us takes practice. It is a practice we can call prayer, or an open heart, or even the discipline of welcoming the moment before us. As we rush toward the holidays, which in this season of still pandemic, we find that most things have changed. What was familiar is not, and not only have many of things we expect changed—we too have changed. I invite you to pay attention to every moment you can in gratitude—to be thankful toward God for even little, tiny things. Perhaps it is the wonderous color of a tree changing colors as it prepares to drop its leaves, or the smell of a candle lit against the dark, or the familiar smell of coffee or tea as the chill grows in the air. When Jesus looked around him and looked at the beauty of the moment inviting us not to be anxious but to be in the moment, he had just taught the Lord's prayer. God is near us this minute, embrace even this hard moment. God is with us, caring for us, even us we reach out to care for others

"Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? Therefore, do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed, your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. We are grateful for Pastor Todd and especially grateful for his faithful leadership during this pandemic and keep him in our prayers during his sabbatical.

For all the things we are, Oh God, and all the way Christ dwells in us, helping us to love and turn toward more Love—we give thanks.

To all of you, thank you for all the things you do for the community, for Saint Timothy's and for wonderous people of faith that you are...uniquely, simply you.

CHRISTMAS FOOD BOXES FOR MONUMENT CRISIS CENTER!



Yes, we will do **Christmas Food Boxes** in 2021! As you know, we substituted Thanksgiving Food Bags for Christmas Food Boxes last year due to insurmountable logistics. **YOU ALL WERE FANTASTIC!** Together with Noah's Ark Preschool and Peace Lutheran Church, we donated over 390 bags plus turkeys and cash toward helping our neighbors celebrate Thanksgiving in the midst of a pandemic.

This year will be similar to 2019 – but a little bit different.

Confirmation meeting November 14th after 10 a.m. worship



Join the people in St. Timothy's Book Group on **Thursday, November 18**th **at 2:00 pm via Zoom** to discuss *"The Personal Librarian"* by Marie Benedict and Victoria Christopher Murray. The Personal Librarian is the remarkable, little-known story of Belle da Costa Greene, J. P. Morgan's personal librarian--who became one of the most powerful women in New York despite the dangerous secret she kept in order to make her dreams come true.

In her twenties, Belle da Costa Greene was hired by J. P. Morgan to curate a collection of rare manuscripts, books, and artwork for his newly built Pierpont Morgan Library. The Morgan Library became known as a private collection of rare books, manuscripts and art that

competed with esteemed public institutions such as the British Museum. It was she who persuaded Jack Morgan to donate his father's astonishing library to the city. It's a gift that honors J.P. Morgan, his descendants — and the personal librarian who was critical to the Morgan's success. Belle becomes a fixture on the New York society scene and one of the most powerful people in the art and book world, known for her impeccable taste and shrewd negotiating for critical works as she helps build a world-class collection.

But Belle has a secret, one she must protect at all costs. She was born not Belle da Costa Greene but Belle Marion Greener. She is the daughter of Richard Greener, the first Black graduate of Harvard and a well-known advocate for equality.

TREASURER'S REPORT

October 20, 2021

Financial Highlights

- Financial results through September were positive overall with underruns in loose plate
 offerings and facilities cost sharing being offset by higher than budgeted pledge and
 contributing income to date. Expenses also underran by about 8%.
- Year to date budget vs actual results, adjusted for amortizing "pledges paid in full" in the current year, are:

Pledge Income difference due mainly to:

Pledges were better than budgeted in previous months offset by pledges in May, August and September that were less than budgeted. There are also 19 families for \$38,970 who have not made 2021 pledge payments yet.

Other Income difference due mainly to:

Loose Plate \$(5,514) and Facilities Cost Sharing \$(9,153) under budget offset by Contributing Income \$11,647 and Special Gifts \$1,150 above budget.

Expenses – Operating expense difference is the sum of a number of under budget items, with the main ones being:

Personnel expenses \$15,995 under budget due mainly to \$6,299 for administrative assistant/office manager, \$874 for bookkeeper and \$2,034 for childcare assistant position.

Altar Guild expenses \$1,431 under budget
Music expenses \$1,842 under budget
Christian Formation expenses \$1,118 under budget
Children & Youth Ministry expenses \$1,493 under budget
Fellowship expenses \$1,921 under budget
Administrative expenses \$7,036 under budget
Facilities expenses \$9,439 under budget
Contingency expenses \$2,285 under budget

ST TIMOTHY'S VESTRY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

October 2021

The vestry met on Wednesday, October 20, at 6:30 pm in the Grace House Conference and over Zoom

MOTIONS:

- The Vestry voted unanimously to approve the 4 resolutions from the Treasurer regarding the **benefits for parish employees in 2022**.
- The vestry voted to approve the **Grants proposed by the Outreach Committee** subject to the review of the Finance Committee on November 10.
- The vestry voted to approve the new lease for the office copier recommended by the Administration Commission. The Finance Committee reviewed the recommendation and recommended using their choice. The committee recommended awarding the lease to WiZiX.
- The vestry approved the proposed agenda for the October meeting, the minutes of the September vestry meeting, the reports by the Treasurer, the Rector and several Commissions.

ACTION ITEMS:

- **Budget** 2022 Budget requests are due by the November vestry meeting on November 17.
- Parish Family Calls Vestry members will again call the parish families assigned to them. They are asked to remind those who have NOT picked up their July 2021 directory that they are available in the church office and after church in November.
- Masks The church reopening committee will work on revised guidelines for mask wearing in church and on campus after November 1 when Contra Costa County changes their rules.

OTHER TOPICS:

- Pastor Todd discussed the efforts to restart youth groups for those in Junior and Senior High by Pastor Todd and Robbie Frederiksen with the San Ramon United Methodist Church. Attendance of youth from St. Timothy's has been low.
- 2022 Annual Meeting will be scheduled for Sunday, February 6.
- Masks in church and on the church campus after November 1 when Contra Costa County is scheduled to change the local rules were discussed. Changes for church services will have to wait for guidance from the Diocese of California.

Parish members are welcome to attend Vestry meetings. The next meeting is on Wednesday, November 17, 2021, in the Grace House Conference Room at 6:30 pm.

The minutes of the vestry meeting will be filed in the Parish Office and published on the church web site after they are approved by the Vestry.
